STEVE: I wish that -- you know, I hope -- I don't know that you're doing that or not, but I wish you had a speaker phone or a recording that when you talk to him or to me they could hear what he's saying, I'm hearing. They can judge of the tone of voice, material, the subject matter, whatever. But I think that you would see us to be sincere. I mean, like I told or I'd tell them, is the program -- nothing's changed other than that, you know, from the time I've met him his experience has been one that's been of an other worldly way where I've not had experiences like that or I -- nor have I ever known anyone else to have had that. So, you know, like his every move, it's always been based upon how he's to be led.

HENRY: Right, but --

STEVE: So that's, you know, that's where the difficulty comes in with not only a situation like this

but, you know, there's been other ones where people don't know or understand that or it's something that's out of the ordinary to them.

HENRY: Um-hum. See, but during this entire process if we were, we were saying to you or telling you that we were going to do one thing and we were working, you know, in such a fashion that we were starting to trust each other real well, and I asked you for something very significant and you said yes, but in, in return for that I would like you to do this for me, and I would say as soon as you do that for me, I will do that for you immediately.

STEVE: And I -- can I just say one thing?

Really what it comes down to for him and myself -- this is really what it would be for me as to why I'm even waiting on him and I know that even if I -- and, by the way, I did ask him multiple times and he kept on giving me that same answer, "Wait." So it didn't matter how many times I asked him.

HENRY: Um-hum.

STEVE: But the bottom line for him as why he doesn't deviate from that or even myself is because -- and that's what I don't think you would understand like I would or my experience has been. That's fear God. I mean, he fears that if he does other than that which has been given to him, he is in no end of trouble and

responsible for many, many individuals, more than those 2 that are here. 3 HENRY: I understand. 4 STEVE: And like with myself, that's why I don't push him or anything because the experience I've 5 had with him is that it's always worked out for the 7 best. 8 HENRY: I understand. 9 STEVE: So that's -- so, you know, it's like 10 I'm caught between a hard place and a rock. I appreciate who you are and what you're -- and you want 11 to do and there -- and what we've worked up to this 12 point, but it's like, it's like there has, from your 13 14 perspective probably, been a wrench dropped in there. 15 HENRY: That's right. 16 STEVE: And I understand. That's what I'm 17 saying. 18 HENRY: Because, because we went out on a 19 limb to get a lot of these things. 1 JIM: Okay. 2 STEVE: But the main issue -- I don't want to get away from the main issue of why I'm here and the 3 whole reason for this. 5 JIM: Um-hum. 6 But safety is not the number one 7 thing. 8 Well, come out. You know, we want you JIM: to come out so your message can get out. I don't see 9 10 11 STEVE: I don't believe -- I mean, I'm going to be coy with you. I'm going to be straight with you. 12 I do not believe that for a moment, of course, but at 13 the same time I'm going to still work with you and 14 we're going to still do what -- he said that. I still 15 16 believe --17 JIM: Didn't we give an opportunity now, 18 Steve? 19 STEVE: Yes, we did. That's like -- I totally agree with you. I totally agree with you. 20 21 JIM: And we kept our part of the bargain. 22 STEVE: I believe you did, but he told me some things that -- I suppose I should have written it 23 down in detail and given it you as you said it because 24 I was just talking with him back just before you 25 called.

1 All right. Look, Steve --2 STEVE: And about this whole thing about lying and deceiving and all the rest. With your agency 3 right from the beginning, I'm talking about. 4 5 JIM: Um-hum. 6 STEVE: And what your agency has done in the past with people, an inside record, of course. 7 I mean, to tell you the truth, I see you agency and other 8 agencies like yours as Big Brother. I really do. That's -- one way or the other I see that happening 10 because, of course, I believe that there is a 11 trilateral commission and a council on foreign 12 relations. The Bible says merchants would be the great 13 men of the earth and by their sources they deceive all 14 15 of mankind. 16 JIM: Um-hum. 17 STEVE: You're right in the system. Revelation 13, "All the world wonders after the beast 18 and worships the dragon, " which is the devil, so if 19 there's a God, if that Bible's true, that's what you 20 and I are both doing, but I acknowledge it. And then 21 there's a way that the Bible shows to get out of this. 22

JIM: Well, you have to acknowledge that, that we've kept our word about getting your message out on the mediums.

STEVE: And right now the people are still

I mean, how 21 can we guarantee that to you? You know I keep my word 22 and if you come out -- you know, one benefit of coming 23 out besides safety, medical treatment, is that --24 25 I realize all that. You know, you STEVE:

could offer me everything in this world --

1 JIM: Steve? 2 STEVE: -- and it still wouldn't change if his God which showed me this -- all these other truths 3 said wait. I can't -- look it. I fear God. 4 5 - JIM: I know. 6 See, you don't understand. If you ever read the Bible -- okay. You're off again. 7 8 JIM: No. No. Go ahead. 9 STEVE: Okay. The bottom line is we have -we fear God. If you read the Bible and you see what 10 God is going to do to people who have rejected 11 opportunities to see what he has as a truth in the 12 final days -- take a look and see what God's going to 13 do to people that discount that kind of grace and a 14 gift like that, a free offering, to all of us that are 15 so wicked and so innately selfish, when everything 16 revolves around our own little spectrum of a world. 17 18 JIM: All right. 19 STEVE: I mean, and you don't see it. You're not convicted by it. That's fine. But I am, you see, 20 and you don't understand my phrases when I say 21 22 something --23 JIM: No, but I appreciate --STEVE: -- like being -- having a fear for 24 25 God.

JIM: No, but I appreciate your position.

1 STEVE: I don't want to die and find myself 2 in the wrong place. I know I must give an account to God for all things. I know that. So that's why 3 everything I do on a day by day basis, moment to moment, is thought out. And I was asking God -- if 5 there's a God, look, I'm asking for wisdom. Give me discernment. So, I mean, even in a time like this I -that's why I say I appreciate everything you're saying. If I was sitting in your chair with your lack of my 9 understanding, I'd probably be saying the same thing to 10 11 me, Jim. Well, Steve, let's just say this. I 12 mean, you can say that I don't understand, but you 13 can't say that I don't appreciate your feelings --14 15 STEVE: No, I would not --16 -- and I do appreciate your feelings. JIM: 17 You're right. I would not say that. 18 And I am concerned about you and I am concerned about David and all of the other people. 19 20 STEVE: I believe that. I believe that. 21 I care about what is going to happen to JIM: 22 all of you. I'm telling you that sincerely. And last night after I left here, I mean, I was really hurt and 23 I had to walk around two hours alone, you know, just 24 because we couldn't come together. I couldn't sleep and, in fact, they almost 3 pulled me off of the phone today and wouldn't let me come back. And I asked them if I could, you know. And 6 I said don't, I said don't do that because, you know, we've established a working relationship and --7 8 So basically I guess the FBI has STEVE: 9 taken oven to run the operation, other than yourself. 10 JIM: No. That's not true. 11 STEVE: No? The FBI is helping and the ATF's 12 JIM: 13 helping and the police are helping. Everybody's working together. There's no taking over really. But 14 I just held out a lot of hope and promise yesterday 15 that a lot of good things were going to happen. 17 STEVE: What has Robert Gonzalez had to sav about all this since? But he -now, this is what you don't understand. If you ever took the time, tonight, whenever, whether you believe in him or not, Isaiah 40 to 66, Joshua 35, Ezekiel 20, 36. Can't do any miracles, doesn't raise the dead, heal the sick, isn't a psychic, isn't anything else, but he does open -- if people have questions about life and death,

I get the, I get the 4 connection. 5 STEVE: We can't, we can't help but say it over -- okay, for -- you know, can't help but say it 6 over and over again. We want to see you make it. I, 7 I, of course, detect, you know, you've got a job to do. 8 9 That's where you're at --10

Didn't he 8 go before a, a magistrate or a judge? 9 STEVE: He sure did. 10 JIM: Well, I mean, how are you drawing a 11 parallel here? 12 (Background conversation.) 13 STEVE: Jim? 14 JIM: Yeah. 15 STEVE: He'll talk to you. 16 DAVID: Hey, Jim. 17 JIM: Hey, David. 18 DAVID: I still love you, Jim. JIM: Hey, how are you? I'm concerned. 19 20 DAVID: My pulse is up. I may be, I may be healed here in a couple days. 21 22 JIM: Yeah. 23 DAVID: And, people, I'm the fastest healer 24 in the world, you know? 25 JIM: Yeah. Okay. Are you -- do you have any pain?

1 DAVID: Oh, yeah. I still got lots of pain. 2 Yeah. You asked a good question about did Christ go before a magistrate. 3 4 JIM: Right. 5 DAVID: That's a good question. 6 JIM: Well, you know, Steve was telling me 7 and I've just drawn so many parallels here that I'm just trying to see that, you know, maybe I should be 8 realizing that that's -- that you're going to go before a magistrate. 10 DAVID: Okay. Now, here's the deal. 11 12 JIM: Okay. DAVID: The night of Gethsemane. You told me 13 14 you were a Christian man. 15 JIM: I am a Christian. 16 DAVID: Okay. What did Christ tell the disciples before they went to Gethsemane? What did he 17 tell them to bring along? 18 19 JIM: Geez, David, I don't know. You tell 20 me. DAVID: Well, they brought two swords, didn't 21 22 they? 23 JIM: Um-hum. 24 DAVID: And who told them to bring them? 25 JIM: Jesus. Okay. DAVID: Okay. Now, you know what a sword was

back in the days of Rome, don't you? 2 JIM: Yeah. Yeah, I know. 3 It was a military weapon, wasn't it? 4 Okay. What's a sword today? 5 DAVID: Well, today a sword is a Renaissance type weapon. It's an ancient weapon. I mean, you 6 7 know. 8 JIM: Yeah. Okay. I'm listening. 9 DAVID: So when Christ stood before Pilate, the prophet Zachariah had already said smight the 10 shepherd and the sheep shall be scattered. 11 12 JIM: Okay. 13 DAVID: But when they asked Christ in Matthew 24 about his coming and the end of the world --14 15 JIM: Right. 16 DAVID: -- the disciples were -- in their minds they were thinking about what Daniel had foretold 17 in the ninth chapter. Now, you see, the prophetic 18 prophesies of Messiah all revolve around a principle 19 that God has always used such as the message of Jonah. 20 When Jonah was sent to Nineveh and he prophesied, all 21 22 the people repented, didn't they? 23 JIM: Yeah, um-hum. 24 DAVID: And so God stayed his judgments, 25 didn't he?

JIM: Yes. That's right.

1 DAVID: So when Christ was teaching the 2 gospel --3 JIM: What's wrong with that -- I'm sorry. Go ahead, David. I heard a noise in here. 4 5 DAVID: Okay. When Christ was preaching the gospel, the people kept asking for more and more 6 evidence, didn't they? 8 JIM: Right. 9 I mean, defend 5,000 one day and the DAVID: next day the same 5,000 rejected him --10 11 JIM: Right. 12 DAVID: -- because he wasn't going to keep 13 doing it, was he? 14 JIM: That's right. DAVID: He made himself of no reputation, 15 16 right? 17 JIM: Right. 18 DAVID: He tried to stay low, didn't he? 19 JIM: Right. 20 DAVID: He did all the miracles and all the original zealots that John the Baptist for following 21 him until he began to speak words such as unless you 22 eat my body and drink my blood, you have no life in 23 you. But they said -- you know, they rejected it, so they followed him no more. Okay. DAVID TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: Where's the

Bible now? I want to read it to him from the King 2 James. DAVID: Let's take a look at something here. 3 It's found in the book of John. 4 5 JIM: Hey, Dave? 6 DAVID: Yeah. 7 JIM: Excuse me just a second. Did you, did 8 you see that news conference? 9 DAVID: Yeah. It was very -- the news, the news thing, I had a problem with projecting the audio. 10 JIM: Oh, you did? I'm sorry. 11 12 DAVID: So they're, so they're straightening 13 it out. 14 JIM: Well, it's your T.V. because we had it 15 clear here. 16 DAVID: No, no. What happened was -- and 17 then it came through again. 18 DAVID TO UNIDENTIFIED PERSON: The blue 19 Bible. 20 JIM: Oh, the channel did it? 21 DAVID: Yeah. 22 JIM: The broadcast? Oh, okay. Well, we've -- I guess on this -- this hearing here's probably on a 23 hard line cable and maybe yours is a satellite dish or 24 25 something.

DAVID: No. Mine -- the satellite's not

you this. Have you lost your appetite or anything? 2 Are you eating? Can you eat? 3 DAVID: Well, I can say continually sipping on like orange juice or, or soup, chicken soup. 4 5 JIM: Okay. Well, that's good. You can get 6 something down? 7 DAVID: Oh, yeah. 8 JIM: Okay. And --9 DAVID: It did not go into my colon. 10 Okay. And then 7 8 there is also a star of stars revolving around the Star of David. Now, that even itself is not the God of 9 David. Now, the prophecies do talk about the God of 10 David and the Star of David, but it's not in a sign or 11 a symbol. It's not in a picture. Anything that we 12 have in pictures made by the hands of men is not the 13 truth symbol of God. Now, so we have to find out, Jim, 14 15 right now --16 JIM: Okay. I'm listening. 17 DAVID: -- which God we believe in. 18 believe in the God of Moses? Do we? 19 JIM: Yeah, absolutely. DAVID: Well, then how come, how come out of 20 almost three million Israelites that came out of Israel 21 only two of the original adults made it to the Promised 22 23 Land? 24 JIM: You're talking about on the Ark, Noah's 25 Ark?

DAVID:

No.

I'm talking about --

1 JIM: Oh, the two original. 2 DAVID: I'm talking about Joshua and Caleb. 3 JIM: Oh, I see. They were too busy trying to do their own thing under the garment, false garment, of doing God's thing. Now, so we're supposed to try 8 the spirits. Let's just go to the New Testament. 9 10 JIM: Okav. 11 DAVID: People who believe in Jesus today fail to understand that Matthew, Mark, Luke and John 12 have clearly written that no matter how many miracles 13 Christ did, yet they would not believe on him. 14 his own original twelve forsook him. 15 16 JIM: Um-hum. That's true. 17 DAVID: Now, let's get real here for a 18 second. 19 JIM: You're exactly right on that. I 20 understand that. 21 DAVID: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John makes it 22 So in the book of John, you know, all the letters that are printed red, you know? 23 24 JIM: Right. DAVID: Statements such as I spake openly 25 unto the world. I always taught in the synagogue and

in the temple where the Jews always resort and in 2 secret have I said nothing. Why asketh thou me? 3 those which have heard me what I have said unto them. Behold, they know what I've said. Now, if Robert Gonzalez had come into my home and had sit down and had 5 6 remained sitting down and had been honest, I would have 7 told him everything and showed him everything about me. 8 I have never since Day One hidden or withheld anything from a mind that can sit and ask questions and learn 9 with the book opened. Now, if you ask me --10 11 JIM: I agree. 12 DAVID: If you ask me a direct question just 13 to pacify your curiosity in an evil manner, then I will 14 not say anything to you. 15 JIM: Well, what do you mean by that? 16 DAVID: I am saying that if you read Matthew, 17 Mark, Luke and John, you would see that the daily 18 continual process of the Sanhedrim and the Pharisees 19 was to always entangle Christ in his talk, always trying to condemn him in his talk, to get him on 20 21 something, to get him on something. Now, if there is a God, the same God of Moses and Christ, then we begin to 22 see that God is showing mercy to the Jews and the 23 Gentiles for a reason. Why? God does not execute judgment on the ungodly immediately, so pride and arrogancy, self-will begins to grow and grow and grow in man until finally he thinks in his own mind, in his own perceptions of 10 the right ways of God. Jeremiah and all the prophets 11 already spoke against this. Like in Jeremiah 16 when 12 it talks about the Jews and says you have been worse 13 than your fathers in that you walk everyone after the 14 15 imagination of his own heart. 16 JIM: Right. DAVID: Now, did Christ choose twelve? 17 18 not one betray him --19 JIM: Yeah. That's right. 20 DAVID: -- with a kiss? 21 Yeah, um-hum. That's right. JIM: 22 DAVID: Okay. 23 Judas, right? Right. 8 DAVID: And the others ran against 9 Gethsemane. 10 JIM: Um-hum. DAVID: Okay. So Christ --11 12 JIM: But --DAVID: -- Christ is placed in the 13 14 jurisdiction of Pilot, right? 15 JIM: He went to the, to the court. 16 DAVID: Okay. And Pilate told him, he says, 17 hey, take him and judge him according to your laws. The Jews, therefore, said unto him it's not lawful for 18 us to put any man to death. Hey, it's not a matter of 19 20 judgment. It's a matter of executing judgment, isn't 21 it? Um-hum. 22 JIM: 23 DAVID: You know, they're telling, they're 24 telling Rome that we did not have our political law of which we originally had to execute capital punishment 25 on a man.

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: So what takes place is that the -
the Jews, therefore, said unto him it's -- death, that

the -- of Christ may be fulfilled which he spake

signifying that he should die, which is the crucifixion

which was the means of capital punishment for the

Romans.

JIM: Right.

DAVID: Then Pilate entered into the judgment hall again and called Jesus and said unto him art thou the king of the Jews, which you know in a political statement that would be treason, wouldn't it?

JIM: Right.

DAVID: Jews were actually Romans at this time, weren't they?

JIM: That's true but, David, let me ask you this. Wouldn't it -- wouldn't the process have to be the courtroom and maybe the, the -- an acquittal and then -- or some situation like that, and wasn't it -- I remember Barrabas and how that all changed, you know. I don't know. It's confusing to me.

DAVID: Well, here's the thing. Well, here's the thing. It says right here. See, Jesus is under observation with Pilate now. Pilate's trying to figure him out, right?

JIM: Right.

1 DAVID: Okay. Jesus answered --2 JIM: But it's a court. It's a court. 3 DAVID: Well, not yet. In those days, in those days even Rome, closer to a democracy of our 4 time, it was in the hands of one or two rulers to 5 decide a man's fate, and Pilate just had that kind of 6 7 power. 8 JIM: I know you're unhappy with Robert, but 9 10 DAVID: No, no. You know, why didn't he just, you 16 17 know, just when I was jogging out there on the road, you know, and, like I say, you ain't carrying no 18 weapons when you're jogging are you? 19 20 JIM: Right. 21 DAVID: You know? I mean, Robert and them 22 They were doing some jogging too. 23 JIM: Right. 24 DAVID: But when you carry a fanny pack, what 25 do you got? JIM: Right.

DAVID: Okay, so the thing of it is, that 1 2 would have been a whole lot better, Jim. 3 JIM: Well, I understand that, and when you 4 come out --5 DAVID: Okay? 6 -- when you come out, you can confront 7 Robert and talk to him about that. 8 DAVID: Yeah, we know that's going to happen. 9 Now, here's the thing. JIM: Well, why not? I mean, you can talk to 10 11 him. 12 DAVID: Well, like I say, get him on the 13 phone for me as soon as you can. I would like to --JIM: You know what I'm starting to think, 14 David, I'm starting to think, this is unusual for me, 15 you know, bear with me, but I'm, I'm starting to think 16 that when you, when you walk out with your people that 17 the authorities, I mean, somehow are unknowingly 18 helping you fulfill some prophecy. 1 JIM: David, you know I don't know the 2 scriptures like you. 3 DAVID: No, no, no, hey, you've got to open your book and take a look and see what the quy's 4 5 saying. Maybe the prophecies are a bunch of nuts, or 6 maybe you're just lying --7 JIM: No, no. 8 DAVID: Maybe you have no faith at all in the 9 Bible. 10 JIM: No, but aren't the prophets the ones who clarify the word for the people who don't 11 12 understand it and bring the message? 13 DAVID: Aren't the prophets the one who 14 testified before what they were told of God regarding 15 the coming of the events of Messiah? 16 JIM: Right. 17 In other words, how would it be, what it would be like when Messiah would appear. 18 19 JIM: But, but, what I'm saying, David, 20 didn't they explain things to people so they'd 21 understand, I mean, you know I've never lied to you. You know that's true. I have called you and told you 22 23 everything that was happening and I've never lied to you. If I didn't know, I said, "I don't know." I 24 haven't tried to fool you on any -- you know that's 25 true. I've told you I don't know the scriptures.

1 DAVID: Exactly, so --2 I've told, I've told you that JIM: 3 everything, whatever we've said, what I said or 4 Henry --5 DAVID: Catholics don't know the Bible. 6 JIM: Well, I'm not saying that. 7 It's not promoted to know scriptures in Catholicism. All you're to learn is your catechism. 8 9 JIM: I see. DAVID: The rules of the church. 10 11 JIM: You know it, David. You know. I know you know it. You've told me about it. 12 DAVID: Oh, Jim. 13 14 I, hey, I understand that. I really --15 How can we come to an agreement and how can we get back to where we were yesterday and start moving some of the 16 17 people --18 DAVID: Well, like I said, you deal with your bosses, I'm dealing with my father now. 19 20 JIM: All right. 21 DAVID: You all can go ahead and laugh --22 JIM: I'm not laughing, David. 23 DAVID: -- and stand back and ridicule and speculate over where we're coming from, but it's like 24 this, this is the United States of America, and we may 25 be just chalked up as one more cult group.

1 JIM: Not to me you're not. 2 DAVID: But there are seven seals and as long as you do not permit me to show you --3 4 JIM: I did permit you. We let you play your tape for an hour on a national network. 5 DAVID: Wait a minute, wait a minute, wait a 6 minute, wait a minute. What did you learn from that 7 8 tape? 9 One thing I learned is you let me down, JIM: 10 you didn't keep your word. DAVID: You weren't listening to the truth 11 12 anyway. 13 Well, David, I'm trying to understand, JIM: 14 and I'm trying to --15 DAVID: You're trying to understand why our actions have been so dramatic in regards to your 16 systematic, bureaucratic system of government. 17 JIM: Okay. 18 19 DAVID: We have gone against you. guy, the little guy's come up and pushed at you. We 20 told you, you're not going to come here and push your 21 little ATF butt around. 22 23 JIM: Right. 24 DAVID: We are Americans too. 25 JIM: All right, I understand that. DAVID: We have bothered no one. We will

serve and believe God and contend on a foundation of 2 doctrine, in the fear of God, as light opens and as 3 doctrine is properly weighed and measured, being systematically harmonized with scripture, text, 5 chapter, book, then we develop an infallible, conclusive picture of what God's will is. Not just a 6 7 little verse here, not just a little verse there. The content must be complete. Now, the very last 8 9 doctrine is not going to be like Martin Luther's 10 doctrine. 11 JIM: All right. 12 DAVID: Martin Luther stood up and put his 13 finger right in the face of your church. But remember, the Roman Catholic Church use to rule Europe. 14 15 Pontiff was the highest form of power known to the 16 governments of man. Do you remember that? 17 JIM: Um-hum, right. 18 DAVID: Now, when Martin Luther --19 JIM: I understand. 20 DAVID: -- was, was by his little self, he 21 discovered in the scriptures, according to Timothy's 22 writings, Paul to Timothy, --23 That's my brother's name. 24 DAVID: Yeah, well, he learned by -- Martin Luther learned by reading the Bible that Paul said that 25 the Spirit told him that in later days there'd be some

who depart from the faith, giving into seducing spirits and doctrines of devils forbidding to marry. 2 3 JIM: Right. 4 DAVID: And commanding to abstain from meats which God has blessed. Now, Luther knew point blank 5 6 that the Papacy taught celibacy, taught celibacy for 7 its priests. Well, we began, he began a search and 8 research and found other documents according to the new 9 covenant. So he married Katherine Van Voyn (Phonetic) 10 in 1525. This man, by being enlightened with the words 11 of God, the words of the prophets, he went ahead and he 12 took a step against his traditional faith as a Catholic and began to stand more on the documents that the 13 Catholics said they believed, but yet they did not 14 15 teach, nor did they do. 16 JIM: You're right about that. 17 DAVID: Now --18 JIM: And I know you're right about that. 19 DAVID: So, in 1530, he developed enough points from scripture to prove that the Papacy was not 20 founded on a scriptural foundation and that many of its 21 laws and many of its edicts were contrary to the 22 foundation established in the new testament. 23 24 JIM: Right. I understand.

1 JIM: Um-hum. 2 DAVID: Do you know how many people died because of Martin Luther's doctrine? 3 JIM: I don't know. 4 5 DAVID: Millions. Millions were considered cultic, demonic, heretic; they were told they were 6 proscribed, they were told to recant by the -- Scott, 7 no, no, don't do that. 8 9 JIM: You okay David? DAVID: Yeah, I'm all right. Now, so you 10 11 see --12 JIM: I, I, --13 DAVID: The, the government of that day was the Roman Catholic Church and Martin Luther was the 14 cult leader. He was the devil. He was the demon. 15 was the idiot and he was the fool, and he was told to 16 recant over and over at the risk of his life. But do 17 you know what happened? There were certain individuals 18 that were lawyers, certain individuals that were kings 19 and they began to listen to this man, and they began to 20 think, for once, on their own. And so what happened 21 is, is that, as they began to think, Martin Luther's 22 23 life was preserved. 24 JIM: Um-hum. 25 DAVID: But he was at least allowed time to

really lay out his complete thesis. Okay. Nonetheless

though, there were people that were beginning to join the Lutheran Church, as I said before, the Jesuit priesthood was developed, which was the Roman Catholics military, and they went out and, like I said, the blood flowed. But the same as when John Knox came in and started the Presbyterian, or Wesley with the Methodist, or Campbell with the Baptist. Each of these reformers were men who asked an honest question in their day in regards to scripture that many organizations were not adhering to. So this is how we came out of the dark ages.

JIM: All right.

DAVID: This is how we came out of the covering of the minds of men from the Papacy.

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: Now, but the dark ages was foretold by Christ already. The prophets had already been told of the abomination that would make desolate. When men are turned away from God, and his laws, and his precepts, that infidelity and immorality increase to such high levels men become worse than base beast of the field. Their passions, their pride, their arrogancies (sic), all these things overcome them and they do not know how to properly rationalize in the fear of God. Now, if you don't fear God, you cannot properly respect nor love man.

1 JIM: I agree with that. 2 DAVID: Okay, now, here's the deal. world has become ultimately corrupted in that when the 3 churches are infiltrated by a spirit so contrary to the 4 5 spirit of Christ, that men will stand in pious position 6 of religious leadership, and they know nothing about 7 the real spirit of sacred faith in God based upon nothing but God's word, then they try themselves to 8 9 become the oracle of God. They give their opinions 10 instead of doctrine. 11 JIM: You're talking about, David, like those 12 ministers? DAVID: 13 I'm talking about, like, the minister 14 -- like the Pope, for instance. 15 JIM: Um-hum, um-hum. 16 DAVID: Claimed such a high piety with God, 17 claims to be vicegerent of God --18 JIM: Um-hum. 19 DAVID: And yet, hey, where is the truth? mean, you know, the church is not just a bunch of 20 21 prayers. 22 JIM: Oh, I agree with you. 23 DAVID: You know, God wants --24 JIM: It's what's inside. 25 DAVID: -- us to listen to him. JIM: It's what's inside, I understand.

I God also, yeah.

DAVID: God is a truth. God is a word.

3 | And --

JIM: And God is as good as his word.

DAVID: Well, here's the thing. When we see that Christ was taken back to heaven, a lot of the prophecies and promises did not come to pass. That's why in Acts Chapter 1, as his disciples walked with him, they said, "Lord, is it now at this time that thou will restore the kingdom again to Israel?" The hope of Israel has been to be freed from amongst the gentile nations that God has allowed to rule over his people.

JIM: Um-hum.

DAVID: Because the truth of God and the laws of men do not harmonize in every degree. So that when the laws of men direct men to go contrary to the laws of God, men must take their stand to either be with God and God's law, or with man and man's law. That's why, in order to receive the seal of the living God, you've got to know what God's will is. You've got to understand his law, the nature of his law, and his will. Okay, now, if a person would turn from that and become roughly ignorant over these issues, then what will happen is, is that prophecy, which is God foretelling of future events, how they shall come to pass and what they shall involve, will be fulfilled

without these individuals. And that's why the bible 2 warns about the beast and its image. God has declared that the nations of the earth that will rule over 3 Israel are limited. The time for Israel's captivity 4 5 has been preordained and limited. That's why when you read Daniel 2, and Daniel 7, Christ talks about the 6 7 abomination of making desolate spoken by the Daniel, 8 Prophet Daniel --9 JIM: Um-hum, okay. 10 DAVID: Daniel tells you that the empires 11 will consecutively as so: Babylon will first rule over Judea, of which they have. 12 13 JIM: Um-hum. 14 Then Nebuchadnezzer, that was the DAVID: King of Babylon. And then the Medes and Persians, 15 Isaiah foretold, would overthrow Babylon and rule over 16 Judea. And then Grecia was to come in and overthrow 17 Medes Persia, but it was just split up into four parts 18 because of the four generals. See, Alexander 19 originally had four generals and he died without an 20 21 heir. 22 JIM: Um-hum, I understand. 23 DAVID: So, what happens is, out of the northern region of this empire, there rised up another 24 empire which is to again, we established all of the 25

other ones back together, and we know what that one

1 was, it was Rome. 2 JIM: Um-hum. DAVID: Now Rome is not suppose to actually 3 fall in one aspect, because the Prophet Daniel says 4 that there will rise up a power in Rome that will speak 5 against the most high God and change God's times and 6 God's laws and it will rule over the world. 7 8 JIM: Um-hum. 9 DAVID: Now, that's where you get your universal or Rome -- Catholic means universal, right? 10 11 JIM: Right. DAVID: So Roman Catholicism becomes a 12 religion, doesn't it? 13 14 JIM: Um-hum. 15 DAVID: See, the nation was very in-depth in regards to spiritualism such as Zeus and Neptune, 16 17 They believe in the God's and they just simply incorporated as Hezeus Christos (Phonetic), which is a 18 greek War God, Hezeus, and they changed the name of the 19 Biblical messiah, Joshua (Phonetic), to a greek War 20 God, Hezeus, which is a short -- long form of Zeus, 21 22 Christos means -- Zeus, --23 JIM: I understand. 24 DAVID: -- who is a War God. 25 David, I understand, and I appreciate what you're telling me.

DAVID: And you were an altar boy to this 1 2 system. 3 JIM: Well --DAVID: Being ignorant of what system you are 4 really under, not realizing what God has forewarned 5 about this power. You were ignorantly involved, which 6 you cannot be condemned for. Why Christ died on the Cross. 9 JIM: I was just a little boy. DAVID: Yeah, see, so Christ died on the 10 cross so that people are forgiven based upon what they 11 12 know or don't know, you see? 13 JIM: All right. 14 DAVID: In other words, under the gospel of the new covenant, let's say a woman was a nun, okay, 15 and that's all she knew. All she knew is the 16 17 catechism. All she knew is what she was taught and she never really had an opportunity or chance to understand 18 19 the scriptures. 20 JIM: Um-hum. DAVID: Well, then she'd be judged based on 21 how good a nun she was. That's the way it's in the 22 23 Judgement of Christ. As you receive Christ therefore walk ye in him, grounded and rooted, built up in love 24
